### We all feel it, so let's name it.

This presidential cycle is seasoning our lives with fear, anxiety, and division. People of every political stripe and candidates themselves are name-calling, inciting conflict, and building walls of hostility. We are not listening to our better selves, our better angels. November 8 cannot come soon enough, but no one expects the tensions to be over.

How can we be "Church" for one another, for the country, for our God?

How do we, in the words of the Constitution of the PC(USA), serve as "a preliminary demonstration of the Kingdom of God to the world"?

I have been contemplating these questions over the past weeks, and offer these thoughts.

#### Back to Basics:

Love God. Love your neighbor as yourself. Love your enemy. Do justice, love mercy, walk humbly with your God.

Practically, what does this mean? Enjoy time with God in nature, in prayer, in worship. Take your neighbor brownies. Visit an old friend in a care center. Call your college roommate. Curb your anger and stop name-calling those who are voting for someone else. Consider that people of good faith, intellect, and reason --- even your friends, family, spouse --- may disagree with you. Pray for the candidate you oppose and the one you favor. Turn the disgust into a random act of kindness.

#### Take care of your body AND your soul.

Turn off FOX or MSNBC and even PBS and NPR. Starting your day listening to the latest insults, abuses and discord sets the tone for your whole day. Set aside a brief listening or watching time later in the day. Limit your time with social media when the rhetoric becomes hostile, insulting, or raises your hackles. Retrieve a recording, a record(!) or a CD of the music of your youth. Go to a free concert. Purchase some whimsical coloring sheets from Carolyn Stich's studio and a set of markers or colored pencils and start coloring. Really. An 84 year old got me into it. It's not just for children any more! Go to the beach and watch the water. Read a Psalm a day, pick up a good novel or comedic movie at Herrick Library. Go for a walk and scuff the leaves.

#### Get some perspective.

Now, and after the election, God is still the Creator of the Universe. Jesus is still Sovereign and Lord, and the Holy Spirit is still present and active in your spirit and in the world. Believe it. This election, despite the rhetoric being spewed, is not for a savior for the United States of America. Of course the results matter, perhaps even drastically, but listen to the wisdom of the Psalmist: "Do not put your trust in princes, in mortals, in whom there is no help... happy are those whose help is in the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord their God." (Psalm 146)

#### Listen to the confident words of Desmond Tutu:

"Good is stronger than evil; Love is stronger than hate; Light is stronger than darkness Life is stronger than death. Victory is ours through Him who loved us."

#### Looking back...

God's Time. Full Circle or straight line? The Church Year Calendar in each Worship Center incorporates the liturgical seasons. It is in the shape of a circle so that we can begin again and again to remember the stories about God and God's work through Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Our 4th/5th graders engaged in The Story of God in Time. In God's Time Box are ríbbons of different colors that are sewn together to be unrolled, representing the beginning of time, the future and to the end of time. The last ribbon signifies that Church is waiting for the time when the world will be the way God meant it to be - no more wars, no more killing, no more dying, nor tears of pain and sadness. When that time has finally and fully come, it will be the time of God's Shalom. And then we will all be with God forever and ever! The kids were surprised to see how long this time line is, especially in comparison to how small the ríbbon representing the birth of Jesus – his life and his death is. A couple of folks from the M & M Café were curious; the kids enjoyed having them join us.



#### HELP KEEP HOLLAND WARM

November is coat month. As you prepare to face a Michigan winter, please set aside jackets and coats you don't plan to wear and children's outgrown snow gear. Bring them to church during the month of November. Collection bins will be under the TV monitor in the M & M Café. Outreach and Community Action House will arrange for distribution to those in need. Plan ahead to donate blankets in January.

# **ARTALCOVE**

The Art Alcove features one of our own members, Michael Van Houzen. Most of you know he has spent the last 40 years carving birds. Sometimes you need a rest, maybe a sabbatical, or a different direction. That is the case for his paintings. The scenes depicted are places close to his heart. Most of them are in Sleeping Bear Sand Dunes National Lakeshore. From birth, his family vacationed there every year. His grandparents owned a small orchard and farm just north of Empire. He hopes you enjoy the paintings as much as he did painting them.



#### Third Quarter – 2016

- Income for the first nine months of the year is about \$11,000 under projected or budgeted income.
- However, inasmuch as the budget was constructed without any "actual" submitted pledges, I do not consider this shortfall threatening, as catching up can occur over the last quarter.
- In fact, we have received approximately \$12,000 more in offerings than at this time a year ago, which is quite a positive.
- Expenses over the first nine months of 2016 are approximately \$15,400 less than the budget plan anticipated, due largely to the following:
  - Outreach has disbursed only \$37,000 of \$45,000 allocated.
  - Pastor and Associate Pastor expenses are about \$3,000 less than budget.
  - Spiritual Growth and Formation Council has disbursed nearly \$3,500 less than allocation, I assume those funds are likely to be disbursed as the fall programming is funded.
  - Year-to-date, then, we have received about 3% less than budgeted, and while this is not a major
    concern right now, if continued throughout the year, we would experience a year-end budget
    deficit.

Beyond the day-to-day and month-to-month, we continue to have sufficient cash reserves. And we have disbursed the building a fair amount on account of the kitchen remodel and then replaced more than that amount by gift. In other words, we are in decent shape:

Cash-on-hand \$93,300

Mission Endowment \$341,800 (compared to \$285,500 at this time last year)

Building Fund \$162,400 (compared to \$140,000 at this time last year)

It is my opinion that we continue to experience financial stability and strength.
