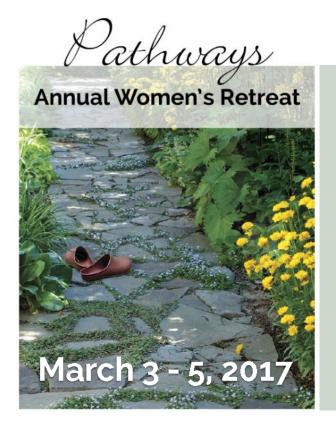
NONVIOLENT COMMUNICATION WORKSHOP

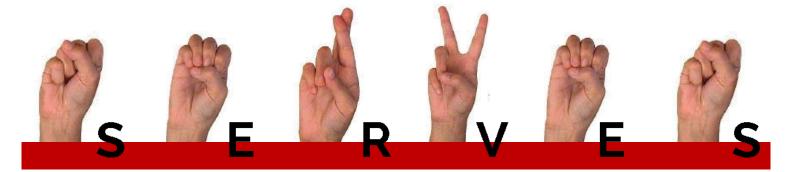
