

A PLACE FOR ALL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Finally!

Yes, it's really happening!

Construction (more correctly demolition) begins on Monday, February 18. By next week you'll find a dumpster on the State Street side of the church at that rarely used and (to many of you) unknown emergency exit near the Nursery. Say goodbye to the lower level as you have known it! Closets have been emptied; chairs, tables, and other furniture relocated; Worship Centers moved, and long unused "stuff" tossed.

The North Entrance (off the parking lot) construction will begin in late March, or when the ground is thawed. Until then, there will be only minimal inconvenience.

A few words from Proverbs, Philippians, and a Philosopher as A Place for All begins this phase.

"Humans plan; God laughs." That's in the Bible, albeit in a less cynical way: **Many are the plans in human minds**, **but the plans of God shall be established.** (Proverbs 19:21) Careful, detailed architectural and construction planning as well as financial stewardship are essential, and our leaders have done their due diligence... but there will be unknowns. Our building reflects our mission and our congregation's personality. The aesthetics, the accessibility, the safety issues we are addressing now bring who we are and how we look closer together. We make these changes not just for fun, but because this is who we are!
