Once there was a hard working woman who led an insecure and timid life. She had dreams of something more: a love interest, a travel destination, a famous chef she emulated whom she longed to meet. She hid all these dreams in a scrapbook titled, *Possibilities*. Only when a crisis struck did she have the courage to turn those possibilities into plans and those plans into reality.\*

God knows people need visions. God challenged the Hebrew prophet Habakkuk to "write the vision plainly", to write it clearly so that even someone running by could read the words.

#### Faith and Culture

Humans ask big questions. It's one of the things that sets us apart from animals. Where did we come from? What happens when we die? Is there a God? Are we alone in this universe?

In July, a college student named Matty Roberts decided to try to find an answer to one of these big questions - do aliens exist? Actually, what Matty really wanted to know was if the government is hiding aliens at Area 51. Matty started a Facebook event called "Storm Area 51, They Can't Stop All of Us" with this description: "We will meet up in Rural Nevada and coordinate our parties. If we Naruto run, we can move faster than their bullets. Let's see them aliens." (You can ask me what a Naruto run is later.)

Matty made this post on a whim, and it was obviously a joke, but, as of writing, about 2.1 million people have said they will attend the event on September 20. (You are reading this after the event, so maybe we have evidence of aliens now! Probably not.) It became a meme, a trendingtopic on the internet.

It also became a topic of conversation at our first youth group meeting of the year. Our first meeting was just before the storming of Area 51 and several of the youth were talking about the event, joking about going there, wondering if anyone would actually show up. It had captured their attention.

The Storming of Area 51 is a funny internet joke, but it is also a perfect example of the kind of thing we will be talking about in youth group this fall. Our fall series is called "Faith and Culture," and each week we will be looking at pop culture events that are in front of teens every day - the raid on area 51, TV shows, movies, news items, celebrity happenings, and more. We will talk about how we, as people of faith, can respond to these cultural events. The Area 51 raid is a big joke, but it allows us to ask bigger questions:

- What is the difference between good and bad peer pressure?
- Are we alone in the universe, and if not what does this say about God and our faith?
- Can we trust the government? Should we trust the Government? What can we trust?
- How do we detect satire on the internet? What is the difference between real and fake news?

These are all pretty big questions that I think we can and should be addressing as Christians.

My hope is not to necessarily give the youth direct answers but to encourage them to have important conversations that allow the scope of their faith to be broadened and the roots of their faith to be strengthened.

And maybe along the way we'll find some aliens. Who wants to go to Nevada?

#### OUT ON THE LAKESHORE Update Supporting LGBTQ + Efforts in Holland

This agency (a 501(c) non-profit corporation) is providing ongoing and new support programs and a safe location for community members to meet. It is one of about ten agencies which receives financial support from FPC through the Outreach Council. This week OOTL announced the appointment of Jeffrey Sorensen as its first center director. Sorensen comes from the Upper Peninsula and graduated from Grand Valley State with a bachelor's in advertising and public relations. He will be responsible for day-to-day operations of the community center along with increasing OOTL's visibility, enhancing fundraising and creating a more consistent and active presence in the larger community.



FPC supported the Holland Project Pride Celebration on June 23rd sponsoring a \$500 information booth in Centennial Park. We were delighted to be able to meet and share the FPC message with many members of the community. Pride revenues this year were almost double 2018 revenues making this year's event the most successful ever. Sponsors were much more diverse coming from churches, businesses and various agencies. Its Friday night social event at the Park Theatre was a great success as well.
