Linda's Keyboard

"As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God.... Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help and my God" (Psalm 42 NRSV).

Our hymnal is full of songs I love to sing, especially when I can sing with the congregation. Because Psalm 42 is one of my favorite Psalms, I gravitate towards #626 in Glory to God, the Presbyterian hymnal. It flows along melodically like the stream of living water. With a pulse that tends toward weight on the first beat of a measure accents fall on the important words: soul, you [God], heart's, long, strength, spirit.

"You" referring to God is sung seven times over. It becomes very prayerful by the end when the final longing is to "worship you." Although it does not follow the wording of the original Psalm, it certainly brings out the meaning of the Psalmist. In the style of a chorus alone rather than a full-blown hymn with stanzas and chorus, it is easy to remember and to keep in my heart.

I find comfort in this Psalm and would like to hear what songs, hymns, Psalms bring you joy or comfort or energy. We are beginning a summer sermon series and request that you follow the link in the eWeekly that invites you to share something about your favorite hymn. You will have an opportunity to be part of the sermon the week your song is chosen. Paul and I will preach also, and any guest preacher will be asked to stay with the series on Favorite Hymns. Thank you for joining us in testimony to the glory of God.

PNC (pastor nominating committee) process update: You have heard that we are searching for a group of people interested in updating our mission for the future. Lauren Stouffer, an elder and member of the congregational nominating committee, is soliciting a small group of folks to assist in reviewing some of the past work done on mission statements, strategic plans, and previous pastoral searches. Peace Camp 2021

One thing that West Michigan has no shortage of is Vacation Bible Schools. I have helped lead many of them over the years (when I was in 6th grade, I led the music at

my home church's VBS). There are families who send their kids to a different VBS each week as a form of free childcare. When you attend a lot of VBSs or help lead them you realize that they are all pretty similar.

But, as you know, we do things a little differently at FPC! Instead of running a VBS, we run Peace Camp. In many ways it looks like VBS (we sing songs, we make crafts, we play games, we need tons of volunteers) but at

its core, it is very different!

Peace Camp teaches the campers (and the leaders) to seek peace in our own minds and bodies and to seek peace for our community and our world. These are not abstract ideas; Peace Camp teaches real strategies for seeking peace in the world. After a week of Peace Camp, campers have new ideas of what peace can be and how they can be agents for peace in the world.

The theme for peace camp this year is "Paths Toward Peace." We came up with this idea as we thought about the labyrinth in the lower level of the church. (We hope to be able to use the labyrinth in the lower level of the church, but if not, we'll draw one in the parking lot!) We'll look at paths to inner peace, relational peace and global peace, giving tools and techniques as we work toward realizing peace in the world.

I am really excited to run Peace Camp this year, and I hope you are excited to be part of it (either as a camper or as a volunteer).

Mission and Outreach









The Children's Advocacy Center is a designated essential service, and the work we do does not stop. During the COVID-19 Pandemic high points of 2020, our case numbers decreased substantially. We believe this was directly related to the fact that children under lock down did not have access to their safe adults to disclose their abuse. Many of them are trapped in the home with their offenders throughout the duration of the pandemic.

However, when schools, churches, and athletics opened back up, we immediately saw an increase of almost 115% in forensic interview cases. We strongly believe this is linked to the access the children regained to their safe adults and were able to finally ask for help. Because of the pandemic:

- · We now offer both telehealth and in-person counseling sessions.
- · Kids Have Rights, Darkness to Light, and other prevention trainings can be held both in-person and virtually.
- · Cora's Care Closet giving has helped staff create "Essential Care Boxes" in order to safely deliver essential goods to our clients and their families.

 The Development Team has had to cancel all three of our annual events for 2020 and restructure them for 2021. We are deeply relying on our community to ensure the sustainability of the free services we provide to our community's sexually abused children and non-offending family members.
