Grace, Peace and Love

When I was in High School the movie, "Saved" came out. "Saved" is a satirical comedy about a Christian Hight School, teen pregnancy, and homosexuality in Christian contexts. I think every High School youth group watched the movie and had a serious discussion about it (the satire was often lost on youth leaders). I vividly remember one scene where a group of girls that called themselves the "Christian Jewels" pull up in a church van next to Mary, who in their eyes is "backsliding into sin." They try to pull her into the van for an intervention, but Mary resists. Mary turns and starts walking away and as she does, the leader of the group, Hilary Faye, takes her Bible and throws it at Mary's back saying, "I am filled with Christ's love!"

Mary picks up the Bible and says, "This is not a weapon, you idiot!" The movie, in the most literal way possible, called attention to the fact that often (more often than we would like to admit) scripture is used as a weapon to marginalize, to exclude, to condemn, and to justify violence and hatred. Scripture is a beautiful book, but it is also a complicated book, and it can be twisted and turned into a tool for injustice instead of a message of grace, peace and love.

This winter and spring (starting Feb 5) we are going to be learning together how to read the bible (and how *not* to read the Bible) in our Midtime class called "How (Not) to Read the Bible." It should be an interesting discussion that will hopefully make us all better at reading scripture and finding the truth and love therein.


