The response to their PIF narrative "Describe the ministry setting to which you believe God is calling you." Included: The most critical aspect of the ministry setting is that truth can be spoken freely. Truth about the community. Truth about the scriptures (What do they *really* say?) Truth about how we lead, how we serve. The freedom to bring doubts and questions without shame.

An open and affirming congregation. A place that is attuned to its environment and culture, listening for the ways it can partner with others in service and care.
