Worship Center: Keeping In Touch

Welcome to the Worship Center!

FPC returned to our fall educational programming on September 25. We were especially glad to welcome back our children and Celebrants to our lower-level Worship Center rooms. We want to invite you to learn about the Worship Center and the ways we invite our children to explore and experience faith at FPC.

Celebrants of the Worship Center were invited forward during Worship, received blessing and encouragement from Rev. Paul, lit their candles from the Christ Candle, and proceeded to carry the Light of Christ's Light to the Worship Center.

On the first Sunday, excitement was felt as our children gathered together – reuniting in a way that has been absent for a while. Among the celebrating, storytelling, and reuniting – I failed to take photos; hopefully the children were able to share with their grownups and families their experiences.

The Worship Center is a Montessori-based way of inviting children to experience God. Stories build on each other and follow the liturgical calendar. Children help create the physical environment by changing the liturgical colors, lighting the Christ candle, and identifying the season of the church year.

Each Sunday, Children enter the Worship Center space ready for worship and sit in a circle on the floor and connect with each other. Children light the Christ Candle and set the table for worship. The Celebrant tells the story, and the children wonder together about what the people in scripture might have thought or felt. Children then respond to the story through movement, art, prayer, re-telling the story using physical materials, or however they choose.

The Worship Center is truly the space in our church that invites children to enter into the awe and wonder of faith. We welcome you to see the rooms and to experience the Worship Center for yourselves any time. We are so glad to be on this journey of faith with the children at FPC!

Report from Pastor Nominating Committee <>>

Report from the Pastor Nominating Committee September 11, 2022

I have been trying to provide updates to the congregation on the progress of the Pastor Nominating Committee (COM) search at least once per month. I know that all of August has passed by without an update.

The PNC has been focused on a single candidate for the past couple of months and hosted this candidate in mid-August for interviews, tours, and a neutral pulpit.

For the past 6 weeks, I have told people who have asked that I will have an announcement soon, and that the announcement would either be good news or the news that the PNC is starting over.

So here we are, into September of 2022. The PNC held our first meeting on September 22 of last year. Now, one year later, I have to stand here and make the announcement that I have said was coming.

It is good news!!

Reverend Cathy has accepted the nomination of the PNC for the call to First Presbyterian of Holland. I am holding back her last name just a little longer as it is extremely important that her current congregation hears about the coming change from her.

We will be planning a weekend at the beginning of November to bring Cathy back to Holland that will include a meet and greet opportunity, as well as a candidate service followed by a congregational meeting. If the congregational vote affirms the nomination, Cathy would plan to start in Holland at the beginning of February. This would be right at the 2-year mark since Linda Knieriemen's retirement.

The PNC: Helen, Bill, Erin, Cassie, Jennifer, David, and I are all extremely excited to be able to bring this nomination to the congregation. In Cathy's words: "Let's see what wonderful things God has in store, building upon the strong foundation you have created!"


