For the Lenten season this year, we have been asking questions together based on the stories from the Gospel of John. It has been a great joy asking questions with all of you, and it has

been especially fun to see the ways that this series has interfaced with the Youth Group. The Youth Group has been asking questions all year long. We have been using a curriculum called *re:form* that helps youth ask and address some of the big questions of faith. Things like: *Is the Bible true? Can it be proven that God exists? Is God male? Why should I pray when God doesn't answer all my prayers?*

These are some big questions to ask! The youth haven't been afraid to dive into deep discussion and to provide their youthful perspective to age old questions. This past week, the question the youth addressed was; *Can I be a Christian without going to church?*

We talked together about how you can be a Christian without going to church, but that being in community with people is a big part of being a Christian. We have experienced this as we have asked questions together this year. It seems to me that a big part of being a Christian is asking questions together with people even if you aren't going to find an answer that satisfies everyone. Hard questions are easier to explore when you are in a community with people you love and care for.

It has been a joy to question with the youth group and it has been a joy to question with all of you this season! If you ever want to visit the youth group and ask questions with us, we'd love to have you!

It will be a part of Hunger Awareness week that includes the postal food drive on Saturday May 20 and the hunger walk on Sunday May 21. The CROP hunger walk supports hunger relief both locally and around the world through CWS. Having the hunger walk begin at Centennial park will allow us to have greater visibility in our community. There will be Information booths from the local hunger relief agencies as well as opportunities for food and fellowship in the park before or after people walk.
