<u>Seasons</u>

Needless to say, I'm a huge fan of Christmas and Easter, Advent and Lent, the promises, dreams and hopes that these seasons offer for us. These are sacred seasons. Still, the fall brings special days, too, and before the rush of the Christmas season arrives, we have the opportunity to pause and give thanks. Two of my favorite services take place in the fall.

On the afternoon of Sunday, October 15 we will have a service of Blessing of the Animals, a tradition that comes to us through the life of St. Francis of Assisi. You may be aware that it was St. Francis who introduced the idea of a "living nativity," complete with manger, ox and ass. His hope was that his community could regain the understanding of the simplicity and humility with which Jesus entered this world. It is said that St. Francis recognized all creatures of the earth as his siblings, that he would preach to the birds and befriend the wolf. And so, we, like Francis, will take time to give thanks for the creatures of the earth, for dogs and cats, birds and horses, fish and lizards, all the furry, finned, scaled and feathered creatures that enrich our lives.

On Sunday morning, November 5, we will celebrate "All Saints' Day," a service tinged with sorrow for those who have transitioned from this earth, those whom we dearly miss, a service of remembrance, but also a service that looks to the future. Even as we grieve, as we remember those who sat beside us in the pew or shared a table over coffee, we give thanks for the lives they lived and for God's promise of a home beyond our imagining. We give thanks for the day when we will gather together around God's table in welcome and celebration.

I invite you to take a moment to give thanks for the saints who surround you. Maybe they come in the guise of a beloved pet. Maybe they come as a kind neighbor or fellow congregant. Let us give thanks every day for those who are God's face to us: God's compassion, God's joy, God's abundant presence. Amen.

So far, the items available include knee scooters, walkers, bath bench, crutches, a narrow wheelchair, and a metal form to aid in putting on a compression sock.

These items are not stored in the church but remain with the donors. Deacons will arrange for pickup and delivery. The FPC deacons are so grateful for the work of all of our community to care for each other by providing meals, giving rides, sending cards, praying for, and visiting those of us who need some extra

Session Summary – September 19th

The meeting was opened with prayer and a devotional. Each month the Session receives a Treasurer's report from Bob Knittel, as well as minutes from each council of the church, and the Deacons.

We also received a report from Gail Hering, chair of the Nominating Committee. This committee is in the process of inviting individuals to serve on the Session, the Board of Deacons and the Nominating Committee. They have been very encouraged by the responses and look forward to sharing the slate with the congregation very soon. Carleen Bauer attended the Presbytery's quarterly meeting as a representative of the church (along with Paul and Cathy) which was held on September 16^{th.} Two ministry candidates were examined and approved for ordination, which is always an exciting time for the denomination. Avery Arden was the guest preacher for the morning worship and a panelist with members of the Presbytery who responded to theological, practical and cultural questions regarding those who are transgender.

The session received letters from two individuals, one with questions regarding the Pride flag in the church, and another in support of allowing Out on the Lakeshore to use our space for drag storytime.

The meeting closed with prayer. The Session will meet again on October 17^{th} .
