Altering Time

Our time is oriented by God's time — always has been and always will be. God entered into our time, forever changing it. God lived time with us, forever altering what time really means.

Ultimately, God's entering into time disrupts time, displaces time, disorients time. Not always comfortably. Not always helpfully. Not always desirably. And never how or when expectable. Why? Because divinity took on mortality, eternity entered temporality, and love eliminated death. ~ Karoline Lewis.

A few years back I was reminded (as I slipped in a few moments late for a meeting) that "10 minutes early is too late." That was how the one who spoke these words lived, and I admire him for it. My husband accuses me of saying, "I'm ready," but then always doing three more things on my way out the door. (He's right.) I can usually make it to things on time. I'm rarely 10 minutes early.

Different cultures interpret time in their own ways. Many of our Latino friends carve out time in the afternoon for rest. My German friends always made space for an afternoon coffee. Some of us are early risers and others night owls. We learn our body rhythms.

Whatever our patterns, our circadian cycles, God meets us. God enters our time and changes it, disrupts it, rearranges it, from the smallest fraction of the hour to the longest expanse of time. As we enter this Advent season, let us watch for God's beautiful disruptions of time as we have planned it, and give thanks to God who loves us throughout and beyond the expanse of time.




Prayer Cranes

Each week at the end of Youth Group we share our highs and lows from the previous week or for the coming week. You can think of it as prayers of thanks and prayers of petition. Some people call it Roses and Thorns. We call it Happy/Crappy.

This is usually an informal moment for us to connect as we hear about what is going on in each other lives. But this year, we have re-established our practice of folding paper cranes while sharing our prayers. There is a long tradition of folding paper cranes (specifically 1000 cranes) as a sign of honor or good fortune. We fold cranes as we share our prayers and then each week, we hang them from the ceiling as a reminder of our prayers for each other and a symbol of our hopes and fears. We have a ceiling full of cranes right now, and it is only going to get fuller! If you want to fold some cranes to add to our prayers, we'd love to hang them. Stop by at the end of youth group and we'll teach you how to fold a crane, or follow the instructions below and drop your cranes off in the youth room so they can be added to our evergrowing flock of hope!
