We are beginning the planning for our new study beginning in September. This will fit in nicely with Pastor Paul's call to us about creation care



### Session Summary <>

### February 2024

(The Session is the discerning body of the church, consisting of the active elders, treasurer and clerk, and pastors.)

On Tuesday, February 20th, the Session gathered for its regular meeting. After a Lenten devotional by Beth Magennis, the Session received a presentation from Gary Smith with a proposal to refresh the Outreach kiosk in the entryway. The Outreach Council has been discussing possibilities to improve the area where we meet with community partner representatives, collect donations for our partners, and provide resources and information about these partners. Gary brought a proposal that would incorporate two additional (and versatile) pieces of furniture, along with new collection bins and wall display boards. The Session voted to move forward on this project. (Since the meeting, a donor has offered to cover the costs of these improvements.)

The Session voted on two significant recommendations from the Finance Council. The first was a recommendation to proceed with capital

improvements to our facilities (repaving the parking lot, replacing furnaces, repairing the roof, replacing the lighting, and improving the sound system in the sanctuary) that will be possible due to a generous bequest. The Session voted to proceed with this proposal as this is in keeping with the family's hopes. The Buildings Council will proceed by seeking bids on this work.

The second proposal was to initiate plans for a second capital campaign to pay off the mortgage from *A Place for All* building renovations. It had been acknowledged that this would be necessary at the time of the build. A committee will be formed to proceed with this initiative.

In addition to hearing reports from each council, the Session decided to join in reading Sailboat Church. Written by Joan S. Gray, a pastor and former moderator of the PC(USA), Sailboat Church is an invitation to rethink mission and explore how to lean into the power of the Holy Spirit.

The meeting was closed in prayer. The next meeting will be March 19th.
