During Lent this year, after reading this book with WC children, they created beautiful dragonflies and were gifted with a book to bring home.



So, anytime a person exits homelessness, Good Samaritan provides that household with a Welcome Home basket—a laundry basket filled with household and personal items. You can help provide one of these baskets to brighten someone's day as they open the door to their next phase of life.

In a medium– to large–sized laundry basket, we recommend filling it with items like these:



- · Toilet paper
- Paper towel
- Trash bags
- Paper plates
- · Plastic utensils
- Dish soap
- Laundry detergent
- Cleaning supplies
- · Toilet bowl cleaner

- Toilet bowl brush
- · Deodorant (men's and women's)
- Toothpaste (adult and children's)
- · Toothbrushes (adult and children's)
- · Shampoo/Conditioner
- · Wash cloths and hand towels
- · Broom & dustpan/mop
- · Plastic wrap/aluminum foil
- Calendar

The FPC Session held its regular meeting on Tuesday, March 19 at 7:00. Bill Evenson opened the meeting with a devotional, reflecting on how vital it is for each of us to have someone to lean on.

Bob Knittel, the treasurer, reported on our current financial picture, which has room for improvement. Giving has been down in January and February compared to previous years, and, though we worked hard to trim the budget, contributions are not covering expenses. This is a "wake up call" for our congregation, and we will consider how to effectively communicate with the membership concerning our financial picture.

The Session also discussed the need to extend personal invitations to church members to participate in the work of the councils, especially Spiritual Growth and Worship. We hope to help people find ways to share their gifts and skills with the congregation.
